



Dominique Carriou

Since 2022, Dominique Carriou heads the Regulatory Affairs Department of the European Savings and Retail Banking Group (ESBG), an EU banking association representing some 900 savings and retail banks in 28 European countries. Throughout his career, Dominique has been involved on a wide variety of regulatory banking topics including banking prudential and supervision rules (Basel rules, Banking Package, CRR3/CRD6/SSM), banking recovery and resolution including the deposit insurance framework (CMDI/BRRD/SRMR/DSGD), consumer and investor protection (Retail Investment Strategy/CCD/MCD), and sustainable finance (EU Taxonomy, SFDR, ESG Pillar 3 disclosures). Dominique Carriou is also a member with observer status of the European Central Bank (ECB) Advisory Group on Market Infrastructures for Securities and Collateral (AMI-SeCo). Dominique Carriou has also been actively participating in the European Financial Reporting Advisory Group (EFRAG), European Banking Industry Committee (EBIC) and Financial Data Exchange (FinDatEx), where he engaged as a Board/Plenary/Alternate Steering Group member.

Prior to his current role, Dominique Carriou worked for eight years as a senior policy advisor for ESBG with a focus on banking recovery and resolution, SME financing and statistical reporting. From 2012 to 2014, he also worked for 2 years in consulting in Boston in the United States after starting his career in project management in Paris in 2007.

Dominique Carriou holds a MSc degree in Economics and Business from Kedge Business School, a complementary Master in Microfinance from the Université Libre de Bruxelles and he also studied in the United Kingdom. Dominique Carriou is French and Belgian and is fluent in French, English and Italian.
