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ANNEX II

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SPECIFIC REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR MARKET RISK

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PART I: GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Structure and conventions
- 1.1 Structure
 - 1. Overall, the framework consists of two separate templates:

(a) a template containing information on the thresholds of Article 94 CRR and Article 325a CRR and

(b) the summary of the positions and theoretical own funds requirements under the Alternative Standardised approach.

1.2 Numbering convention

- 2. The document follows the labelling convention set in the following table, when referring to the columns, rows and cells of the templates. These numerical codes are extensively used in the validation rules.
- 3. The following general notation is followed in the instructions: {Template;Row;Column}.
- 4. In the case of validations inside a template, in which only data points of that template is used, notations do not refer to a template: {Row;Column}.
- 5. In the case of templates with only one column, only rows are referred to. {Template;Row}
- 6. An asterisk sign is used to express that the validation is done for the rows or columns specified before.

1.3 Sign convention

7. Any amount that increases the own funds or the capital requirements shall be reported as a positive figure. On the contrary, any amount that reduces the total own funds or the capital requirements shall be reported as a negative figure. Where there is a negative sign (-) preceding the label of an item no positive figure is expected to be reported for that item.

1.4 Abbreviations

8. For the purposes of this Annex, Regulation (EU) No 575/2013 is referred to as 'CRR', and Directive 2013/36/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council is referred to as 'CRD'.

PART II: TEMPLATE RELATED INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. C 90.00 Trading book and market risk thresholds
- 1.1 General remarks
 - 9. The information provided in this template shall reflect the result of the calculation of Article 94 CRR (derogation for small trading book business) and the size of an institutions' on- and off-balance sheet subject to market risk in accordance with Article 325a CRR which determine whether the obligation to report information on the 'alternative standardised approach' or the 'alternative internal models approach' in accordance with Article 430 CRR applies.
 - 9a. All references to Article 94 CRR in the instruction to this template shall refer to Article 94 CRR as applicable from 28 June 2021. The information on the threshold of Article 94 CRR (columns 0050 and 0060) shall only be reported for reference dates after the 28 June 2021.
- 1.2 Instructions concerning specific positions
 - 10. The result of the calculation of Article 94 CRR and information on the size of an institutions' on- and off-balance sheet subject to market risk in accordance with Article 325a CRR shall be reported for each month-end separately in rows 0010 to 0120.

The monitoring of the conditions for both the application of the derogation for small trading book business, in particular Article 94 (7) and (8) CRR, and the obligation to report information on the alternative standardised and internal model approaches, in particular 325a (5) and (6) CRR, requires data from the reference date (T) and the preceding 11 months.

11. During the first 12 months of the application of this Regulation, institutions shall report information on the threshold of Article 325a CRR only for the reference date and the preceding month-ends at which this Regulation was already applicable. Information on the threshold of Article 94 CRR shall be reported only for the reference date and preceding month-ends after the 28 June 2021.

12. The columns of the template provide an overview of the on- and off-balance sheet business subject to market risk. Column 0020 and 0030 contain a breakdown into on-balance sheet and off-balance sheet business for all positions (irrespective of the allocation to the banking book or the trading book). Columns 0040 to 0110 break the on-and off-balance sheet business subject to market risk down by trading book and non-trading book.

Question for consultation

Q1. The template requires a breakdown of the 'on- and off-balance sheet business subject to market risk' into on-balance sheet and off-balance sheet business. Is that breakdown clear, or would you need ad-hoc definitions for differentiating 'on-balance sheet items' from 'off-balance sheet items' to ensure a proper implementation of the reporting requirements? Are there particular challenges or a burden involved in differentiating between on- and off- balance sheet items?

2.1 General Remarks

- 13. This template provides summary information on the calculation of own funds requirements for Market Risk under the Alternative Standardised Approach (ASA) according to Part Three, Title IV, Chapter 1a of the CRR.
- 14. Under the Alternative Standardised Approach (ASA) institutions shall calculate the own funds requirements for market risk for a portfolio of trading book

positions or non-trading book positions that are subject to foreign exchange or commodity risk as the sum of the following three components:

- a) The own funds requirement under the sensitivities-based method as set out in Part Three, Title IV, Chapter 1a, Section 2 of the CRR;
- b) The own funds requirement for the default risk as set out in Part Three, Title IV, Chapter 1a, Section 5 of the CRR for positions in the trading book;
- c) The own funds requirements for residual risks as set out in Part Three, Title IV, Chapter 1a, Section 4 of the CRR for positions in the trading book.
